NOTICE OF PUBLIC MEETING

Notice is hereby given to all interested members of the public that the Board of Directors of the above captioned District will hold a regular public meeting at 1300 Post Oak Boulevard, Suite 2500, Houston, Harris County, Texas, 77056, said address being a meeting place of the District.

The meeting will be held on Thursday, August 14, 2025 at 11:00 a.m.

The Board shall consider and discuss the following matters and take any action appropriate with respect to such matters:

- 1. Receive comments from the public and discuss matters of community interest;
